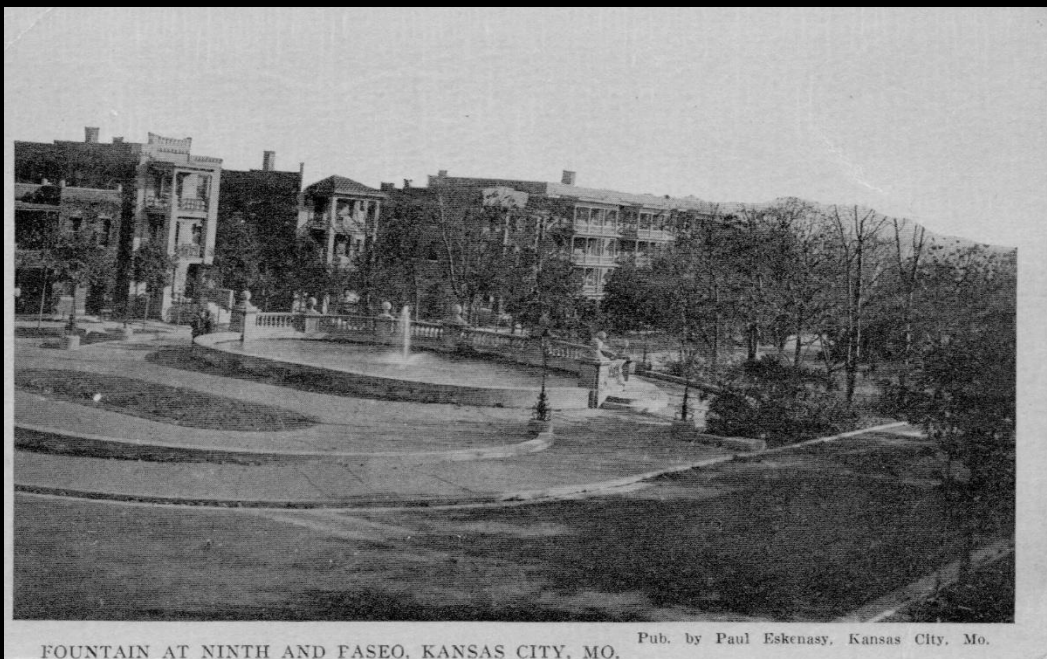

James Ware was living in Kansas City, attending law school. Two days later, on October 3, 1910, James Ware was appointed as stenographer for his grandfather, Elbridge Broaddus, who was the presiding judge on the Kansas City Court of Appeals.
